Dear Ms Reic,

On the occasion of World Hepatitis Awareness Day (WHAD), we would like to invite you to a high-level panel discussion on Hepatitis C which will take place on 1 October at the European Parliament in Brussels from 12.30 to 14.00h.

A highly infectious blood-borne virus, Hepatitis C often leads to severe liver damage such as liver cirrhosis or cancer. As a result, Hepatitis C has become the leading cause of liver transplantations in Europe. These grave and often lethal consequences of a Hepatitis C infection frequently occur only after years of mild symptoms, turning the disease into a "silent killer".

Further to the European Parliament's Written Declaration on Hepatitis C, adopted on 24 March 2007 with an overwhelming majority of 470 signatures, it is now time to discuss how the EU can provide added value in the fight against Hepatitis C with regard to

- Surveillance & Screening;
- Awareness-raising among risk groups;
- Access to treatment.

- Prof. Henrique Barros, Portuguese Presidency representative;
- EU Commissioner Markos Kyprianou (tbc);
- Dr. Srdan Matic, WHO Regional Office for Europe;
- **Prof. Jean-Michel Pawlotsky**, Scientific Secretary of the European Association for the Study of the Liver;
- Representative of the European Centre for Disease Control and prevention.
- Dame Anita Roddick, founder of the cosmetics chain "Body Shop", who was recently diagnosed with Hepatitis C after having been infected for more than 30

years;
